Meeting was called to order at 6:30pm

I. Welcome and Thank yous

President Cari Santiago thanked PTA members for their continued support and dedication to the PTA and Pine Grove Elementary School.

II. Approval of Minutes for General Meeting on 10/3/23

The October 2023 minutes were unanimously approved.

III. Treasurer's Report

- Treasurer Hillary Martell reported that the PTA is in great financial shape.
 - i. The account balance as of 10/31/23 was \$21,970.70.
 - ii. Since October, there are \$3,045.06 in outstanding checks and \$6,215.59 in deposits, so the PTA's estimated cash flow is \$25,141.23.

IV. Principal's Report

- **a.** Principal Lewis thanked the PTA for the Kindness Cart, pies, and assembly. She stated that the staff were thrilled.
- **b.** Principal Lewis told the group about the upcoming advanced academic testing that will be used as a screening process to identify students for advanced Language Arts and Mathematics in grades 3 and 4.
 - i. Previously, this screening was done in grade 3 for advanced placement in grade 4. This year screening will take place in grades 2 and 3 and in future years only in grade 2.
 - ii. Principal Lewis stated that if students switch schools, their school records will move them. Even if students move to another district, BCPS would work with the new district to transfer records.

V. Teacher Report

a. Mrs. D was unable to make the meeting. There was no Teacher Report.

VI. Student Support Network

- **a.** Thanksgiving Distribution
 - 34 families have signed up for the Thanksgiving food distribution which will consist of chicken, eggs, bread, and other non-perishable foods.
- b. December Distribution 12/19/23
 - i. The December distribution will be similar to the Thanksgiving distribution.
 - ii. Please let Cari know if you are able to help.
- c. Coat Distribution
 - i. Ms. Kubala and Okeson have distributed 80 coats to students at school.
 - ii. There are more coats in the S1 closet.

VII. Committee Reports

- **a.** Reading Incentive
 - i. In the first month, there were 235 bookmarks received.
 - 1. Amanda McNeeley reported that students like the riddle, that there are extra pandas leftover, and not having ribbons on the bookmarks is great.
- **b.** Family Events
 - i. Family Events Committee is hosting two dances this winter.
 - 1. The dance for K-2 is January 12th.
 - 2. The dance for 3-5 is February 16th.

Amber Meinhardt suggested a hygiene drive for students.

- Cari stated that the SSN provides pouches for hygiene supplies and that Ms.
 Kubala, Nurse Franker, and teachers help getting these supplies to students that need it.
- It was suggested that this might be a good conversation starter to help families.
